What Does Easter Mean for You?

Purpose: Introduce Easter as a message of **hope and renewal**, making it relatable for those unfamiliar with Christianity.

▲ Time: ~30-45 minutes

Scripture Focus:

- **John 3:16** "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."
- Romans 8:38-39 Nothing can separate us from the love of God.

Lesson Outline:

1 Opening Discussion: Universal Themes of Easter

- Ask: What does springtime mean to you? (New life, renewal, change)
- Easter represents new beginnings, hope, and the triumph of light over darkness.

The Story of Jesus in Simple Terms

- Introduce Jesus as a historical figure who taught love, peace, and forgiveness.
- He gave hope to the poor, healed the sick, and taught people to love their enemies.
- His followers believed He was the Son of God, and after He was crucified, they testified that He **rose from the dead.**

Why Does This Matter Today?

- Easter isn't just about the past—it's about what hope means in our lives now.
- Ask: Have you ever wished for a fresh start? (Connect to personal experiences.)
- Explain that Easter teaches that **change is possible**, **life continues after death**, and **love is stronger than fear.**

Invitation to Explore

- Read Romans 8:38-39 (Nothing can separate us from God's love).
- Invite them to ask questions about spirituality—faith is about discovery, not pressure.
- Offer to share the Bible story of Easter and discuss it together.
